ASK THE ADMISSION OFFICE DIVERSITY ON CAMPUS

One of the benefits of going to college is meeting students from different backgrounds. **Diversity on a college campus** can mean differences in race, religion, ethnicity, gender, geography, etc. When thinking about diversity, consider the following...

Research First

- Check out the “About” or “Fast Facts” sections on a college’s website to learn the demographic breakdown of students attending the institution.

Ask the Admission Office

- Is enrolling a diverse student body part of your institution’s mission statement?
- How will I find people like me and/or faculty and administrators who will understand my experience?
- What does diversity look like to this college/university (e.g., race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, and religion)?
- What does diversity look like in the surrounding off-campus community?
- What places of worship are available on and near campus (e.g., mosques, synagogues, churches, and prayer rooms)? Are professors supportive of students who may need to miss class for religious purposes?
