### Research First

- The Department of Education maintains a campus crime database containing information about the crime rates on all college campuses.

### Ask the Admission Office

- Is your institution committed to keeping campus safe? Can you explain your policy for notifying the campus community when an incident occurs?
- After an incident occurs, how do administrators address it with the campus community?
- Is there a process to report discrimination?
- Are campus safety officials trained in cultural sensitivity?
