Entry Into School

- Fill in the application form. Search the website for financial aid by your college or university.
- Send official copies of your student academic record to the Office of Admissions & Records.
- Take the Compass, ACT, SAT or ACCUPLACER tests and send the results to the Office of Admissions & Records.
- You will have access to a computer at your school or in your city library if you need it.
- Always ask for help during this process, if needed, to begin your studies at the college or university of your choice.



Financial Aid and Scholarships

- There is a minimum period of six to eight weeks to process the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To complete these requests, visit the following site: www.fafsa.ed.gov
- Contact the Office of Financial Aid (financial aid office) of your college or university to ensure that all of your data and information are in order. Don't forget that each college/university has its priority deadlines for applying for financial aid.



Payment of Registration and School Fees

- Record the date payment is due here:
- If you don't have the ability to pay, you may be able to participate in a loan agreement. Get information from the Office of Financial Aid (financial aid office) at your college or university.
- Some courses and programs have additional school fees. Talk to your professors or teachers, listed in the schedule of courses, for more information.

Academic Orientation

- All colleges and universities have academic counseling for students. The academic advisors will talk of academic courses, study programs, and enrichment courses.
- Ask if the courses or programs of interest have entry requirements.
- All colleges and universities offer courses in English as a second language (ESL).
- All colleges and universities offer free assistance with an office of career counseling and counseling (Office of Career and Counseling Services) if you are undecided about a career. Make an appointment if you need this free service.

Registration of Courses

- Write down the first day of registration.
- Register in courses recommended by your Academic Advisor.
- Don't forget to send the certificate of residence, after sign up, to the Office of Admissions & Records.
- Check your schedule of courses to ensure that your selections are correct.



Textbooks and Materials

- You can buy books or materials required for classes in the bookstore of your college or university or online.
- Have a copy of your schedule of courses to determine the textbooks and materials you are required to buy at the bookstore or online.
- If you have problems in obtaining textbooks or materials, talk to your professors and instructors.
